Happy Holidays!

It's the most wonderful time of the year. Many of us celebrate December holidays with family and friends and enjoy hearty feasts and many gifts. It's a time of rejoicing and celebration. Yet many in our communities are less fortunate. The current economy has rendered many families homeless and many more close to homelessness. Fortunately for many the Roanoke Chapter of the AGA was there to help. As part of our December community service we provided much needed assistance to many in the Roanoke and New River Valleys.

We provided financial assistance to a homeless family in Roanoke and a dispatcher's family in Radford whose daughter had recently been diagnosed with cancer. We provided food for ten homeless teenage school children in Montgomery County. Many homeless school children and families have other programs they can rely on, but the older homeless teenagers are often forgotten about. Finally we provided food for nineteen homeless families with children at Pulaski Middle School. I was informed by the Pulaski County Schools Coordinator of Student Services that she was so moved by our efforts she and a friend purchased coats for some of the same family members. She also informed me that one of the families, a homeless mother and daughter, cried when they received the food and coats.

Our December community service was a great success and members should feel proud. Thanks to Katie Miano and Brenda Flora for taking time out of their busy holiday schedule to make the plan a reality. Thanks also to those who attended the November chapter meeting and helped plan the event.

Also during the November meeting we filled committee chairs. Rhonda Driver is the new Membership Chair, Katie Miano is the new Education Chair, and Emily Miles and Phillip Weese are the new Early Career Co-Chairs. We look forward to their many future successes. Committee chairs still to be filled are; Awards, CGFM, and Community Service.
